

Water Saving Tips

- ⇒ Turn of the water while you brush your teeth
- ⇒ Run dishwashers and washing machines only when full
- ⇒ Collect rainwater from downspouts to water outdoor plants
- ⇒ Take quick showers
- ⇒ Turn off the water while shaving. Fill the bottom of the sink with some hot water to rinse your razor
- ⇒ Capture tap water. While you wait for hot water to come down the pipes, catch the flow in a watering can to use later on plans or your garden.

Current Exchange Students Share Their Experiences

Hello my name is Sebastian Brandes and I am an exchange student from Germany. I have lived here in Apex since August the 17th and I am planning on staying until the end of the school year. I go to Apex High School and attend the 11th grade.

My home town is called Cologne and its population is approximately 1 million people and it is the fourth biggest city in Germany.

There are a lot of differences between Germany and the United States. In Germany I live in a townhouse, and everything is closer together than here. The school system here is different, too. In Germany we only have elementary school (1st - 4th grade) and then high school (5th - 13th grade). I had to cope with a lot of new things that I was confronted with at Apex high.

But I had a lot of people who helped me in school, so that problems didn't seem that big. And as my English got better everything seemed to become easier.

I like to play a lot of sports like basketball, soccer, volleyball, skiing and snowboarding, and I like to hang out with friends. Here I help coach a basketball team, which plays in the Apex recreational league.

I have been on some really awesome trips during the time I was here. I have been to Gatlinburg in Tennessee, to the beach in Wilmington and I saw Niagara Falls in New York State. I currently live the Bingham's on Castleburg Drive.



Hi everybody, my name is Aliya Yabekova and I'm from Almaty, Kazakhstan. I live with Allan and Erin Kalbarczyk here in Charleston Village. Two years ago I couldn't imagine that I could be here! I'm so glad that I passed everything that I had to in order to be a "flex" finalist. "Flex" is a program for students from past Soviet Union countries. If you pass the test you can come here from free to study in high school and have the experience. Its paid for by the American government. There are 100 people from my country all over the U.S.



I came here for one school year starting 5 months ago, and I'm enjoying staying here. I

have really great host parents and cool friends. It is totally different here than back home, for example we live in apartments since houses are really expensive. I've been to NYC and life in my city, Almaty, is a little bit similar, but not so busy. Schools there are not divided into elementary, middle and high school. Everyone studies in one school and for all 11 grades you study with the same people in your class. You can't choose your classes. Everyday you have a different schedule. I really like the fact that you can choose your classes here—it's really cool!

I have a lot of things to share, but I can't write them all. Thanks for reading this!
